

Change It, Don't Change It




HUNTER: Okay so Jeff and I have done a new pass at the show incorporating potential changes from the Off-Broadway draft.





JEFF: I'm gonna add musical bridges in "What Kind of Girl is She?" and "Part of it All."


HUNTER: Also since we want to include everything that's happening now, the whole Off-Broadway run will go into the old festival medley so we can keep the running time around ninety minutes.

HEIDI: CHANGE IT.


HUNTER: Why anyone would think a tiny, "insidery" downtown show would appeal to a wider audience is beyond me.





HUNTER: I'm sorry, but four chairs and a keyboard do not a Broadway musical make.

HUNTER: That said, I wouldn't be surprised if their crappy show actually does get to Broadway and








HEIDI: Hey, hey sorry I'm late. My "Ursula" fitting took forever.

SUSAN: It's okay, you're fine. He's just "ABH."


HEIDI: What's ABH?

JEFF: What?


HEIDI: So what, you wouldn't say, like, "Mary Stout got hit by a hot dog cart?"


HUNTER: No, we should say like..."Al Roker got hit by a hot dog cart."






HUNTER: I think we should clean up the language in the show.

SUTTON FOSTER (V.O.)







HUNTER: Oh my god, Sutton Foster called and said she's


interested in talking to us about the show.


HUNTER: I think she could be great in Heidi's track.
